The North Carolina Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Division recently received our FY 2017 Comprehensive Federal Annual Monitoring and Evaluation (FAME) report. The report indicated that following a thorough on-site program evaluation including the review of 136 case files, analyses of OSHNC activities, staff interviews, procedure reviews and performance evaluations that OSHA did not note any adverse findings. We were pleased that the results of this latest FAME highlighted performance activities that support that North Carolina continues to maintain an effective state administered OSHA program. As the FY 2017 FAME revealed no findings, no Corrective Action Plan (CAP) is being submitted.
