PROCLAMATION  
BY THE  
GOVERNOR

TO THE PEOPLE OF KANSAS, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Kansas workers deserve to work in a safe and healthy environment; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Department of Labor's Industrial Safety and Health Division and the United States Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration have each been deeply committed to the safety and health of working men and women; and

WHEREAS, by working together as Kansans first, labor and industry have joined with one another to prioritize workplace safety through outreach and education efforts; and

WHEREAS, continuing efforts are needed to improve safety at all worksites and promote public awareness about the dangers of work zones and worksite hazards; and

WHEREAS, since 1989, April 28th has been recognized locally and nationally as Workers' Memorial Day as a time to remember the courage and integrity of Kansas workers and to renew our commitment to securing safe and healthy working conditions for all employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Laura Kelly, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF KANSAS, do hereby proclaim April 28, 2023, as

Worker's Memorial Day

in the state of Kansas, and I urge all citizens to join in this observation.
